Elevate Shabbos III At the Philadelphia Community Kollel

On Shabbos Parashas Emor, the Philadelphia Community Kollel held their annual Elevate Shabbos of Inspiration, with Harav and Rebbetzin Naftali and Tehilla Jaeger.

Three years ago, Rav and Rebbetzin Jaeger joined the Philadelphia community for their first Shabbos of Inspiration, which was a tremendous success. The community was looking forward to another unforgettable Shabbos, and they were not disappointed.

"When guest speakers connect with the crowd on a personal level, it is exponentially greater," remarked Rabbi Yoel Dovid Zeffren, associate Rosh Kollel. "The purpose was not as much to hear *shiurim*, but to have the opportunity to have an Adam Gadol come to town with his Rebbetzin, and for community members to be able to 'hang onto their coattails,' as they go through Shabbos. It was an incredible experience."

The weekend, which stretched from Friday afternoon through Sunday evening, was jam-packed with programming for men, women, and children. There were very well-attended community Shabbos seudos, at which participants were able to speak with the Jaegers personally for a few minutes and obtain eitzos and brachos. A wide variety of shiurim were delivered throughout Shabbos.

At a Motzoei Shabbos kumzitz, while sitting around a bonfire, Rav Jaeger answered a variety of hashkafic questions. On Sunday morning, there was a Kesher mother and daughter program, in which Rebbetzin Jaeger spoke to the girls and then to young mothers. On Sunday, Rav Jaeger delivered a shiur on the topic of Pesach Sheini at a local shul.

An additional element of the program was the participation of Harav Yonason Sasportas, a Sephardi Rav who is a Rosh Chaburah in Beth Medrash Govoha and active in the Bais Horaah of Lakewood, as well as renowned mechaneches Mrs. Chaya Rivka Leiser from Lakewood.

On Sunday evening, Rav Jaeger addressed the final, keynote event, the Dr. David E. Epstein, z"l, Memorial Lecture, entitled "How to Survive the Challenges That Lie Ahead." Rav Jaeger's main message was that all the volatility in the world is indicative

of the fact that Hashem has put us in the driver's seat. When a driver veers off course, it causes turbulence or worse. If we steer back onto the proper path, by pursuing Torah as a way of life, that will be our lifesaver during this storm. Whatever happens in the world reflects the way that *Klal Yisrael* is behaving, and the volatility is a message for us to get back on course.

Rav Jaeger mentioned many times throughout Shabbos that he found the Philadelphia community to be one with a tremendous warmth and bikush to learn. The desire to learn - ratzon -

In a reflection of how successful the Shabbos was in reaching its goal, one community member remarked that as he was leaving this final lecture, he felt a tinge of sadness, as he wished that the weekend would not come to an end.

"I personally felt a tremendous aliyah," noted Rabbi Zeffren. "Just being in the presence of a Gadol like this, and spending Shabbos together, was very special. It made a big roshem."

Last to speak was Mrs. Aydla Vechter, a close friend of the family. She spoke about Rabbi Plotkin's tremendous chessed and ahavas Yisrael. He was always willing to help anyone who needed it, and he did it with a *geshmak*. The day he went

into cardiac arrest, he told over the *Hayom Yom* (a short daily thought) from Vav Adar, which says, "It is a wondrous trait, when G-d grants a person a warm sensitivity and a pleasurable satisfaction in doing a fellow Jew a favor." This is the way that Rabbi Mendel Plotkin lived his life.

The Plotkins are all about achdus and unity with such warmth for every Yid.
