Parshas B'shalach 5772

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Opposite Attractions

"Egypt pursued and came after them ... into the midst of the sea... And Hashem churned Egypt into the sea... there remained not one of them." (Shemos 14:23-29)

Chazal refer to the miracle of krias Yam Suf, the splitting of the Sea of Reeds as being a difficult task for Hashem to perform. Why is this so? Also, the gemarah in Sotah (11a) explains why the Egyptians instructed the Jewish midwives to dispose of the Jewish babies by specifically casting them into the water (as opposed to other methods of killing). The Egyptians were well aware of Hashem's typical method of punishment: taking vengeance midah k'neged midah, measure for measure. Since Hashem pledged never to destroy the world with a mabul, flood, ever again, the Egyptians were confident that Hashem couldn't possibly take revenge by means of water. In essence, they attempted to 'outsmart' Hashem. How then could the Egyptians be so foolish as to not foresee the obvious: following the Jews into the sea would be an opportune time for Hashem to take the necessary steps to take revenge via the water?

The Ben Ish Chai cites a *Zohar (Vayeira 113b)* in an attempt to answer these questions. The *Zohar* explains that it is uncharacteristic of Hashem to perform a miracle that involves the two opposite traits of mercy and judgment. Generally, Hashem performs miracles with either absolute mercy or absolute judgment.

Ultimately, the Egyptians became privy to this information and figured that the miracle of *krias Yam Suf* was undoubtedly that of mercy. If so, it would go against the norm for Hashem to take vengeance on them by causing them to drown in the waters of the sea. Thus, the Egyptians planned wisely, for as long as the Jews were still in the sea there would be no reason to fear Hashem's wrath. This understanding gives clarity to

why *Chazal* refer to the splitting of the sea as 'difficult' for Hashem. In order to rescue *Klal Yisroel* Hashem opted to change the nature of His miracles and displayed acts of both mercy and judgment simultaneously. Furthermore, in the morning *tefilla* of *Ezras Avosainu* (which is said following *Shema*) we recite, "You split the Sea of Reeds for them; the wanton sinners You drowned; the dear ones You brought across; and the water covered their foes- not one of them was left." The prayer seems to be out of sequence. First *Klal Yisroel* crossed the Sea of Reeds and only *then* the Egyptians drowned. Why is the order reversed?

According to the aforementioned the question doesn't begin. The Egyptians only went into the Sea with the impression that Hashem wouldn't punish them by means of water as long as He was acting with mercy. To their dismay Hashem altered His usual 'miracle guidelines.' Thus, the drowning of the Egyptians was concurrent with *Klal Yisroel's* crossing of the Sea. The chronology of the prayer is therefore quite accurate. It also adds an additional insight regarding the magnitude of the miracles performed by Hashem for *Klal Yisroel*.

Perhaps now we can explain the *gemarah* (Sotah 2a) which states, "Pairing up a husband and wife is as hard for Hashem as the splitting of the Sea of Reeds." Hashem changed the nature of the world by simultaneously using two opposing attributes, those of mercy and judgment, by the splitting of the Sea. Similarly, when matching up a husband and wife Hashem purposely ensures that there will be opposite traits involved in the match. Because this is done to help build and strengthen the relationship between spouses Hashem make the difficult decision to shift from His normal governing of the world.

May we be *zoche* to appreciate the gift of marriage Hashem has given us and, like *Klal Yisroel*, recognize the need to sing praise for all that He has done.
