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True Treasure

"And now, if you hearken well to Me and observe My covenant, you shall be to Me the most beloved treasure of all peoples, for Mine is the entire world." (Shemos 19:5)

Why does the *pasuk* conclude with the words, "...for Mine is the entire world?" This statement seems to have no correlation at all to the beginning of the *pasuk*.

Rabbi Yitzchok of Volozhin (1879-1948), z"l, answers the following: The gemarah in Berachos (33b) teaches, "Hashem has nothing in His treasure house other than the merit of yiras shamayim, the fear of Heaven." What is so unique about the fear of Heaven that only it merit's to be placed in the treasure house of Hashem? R' Yitzchok explains further. Generally, one can define a precious object based on its rarity; the rarer the object the more precious and valuable it becomes. Because the owner of such an object understands its rarity he immediately puts it away for safekeeping. On the other hand, items which may have significant value but are not rare are not stored for safekeeping, for they can be attained with ease at any given moment. When the *gemarah* tells us that only yiras shamayim is worthy of being stored in the treasure house of Hashem we can understand why. There are many good qualities that people possess; however, obtaining fear of Heaven is the only quality that, by its nature, is unattainable for Hashem. Thus, when Hashem encounters the 'rare' quality of yiras shamayim He immediately stores it in His treasure house. Every other positive quality that is present already exists within the 'essence' of Hashem, as we say in Tehillim (99:5), "Hashem, Yours is the greatness, the strength, the glory... for everything in heaven and on earth is Yours." Now we can fully understand the conclusion of the pasuk. Hashem told Klal Yisroel that if they were to serve Him with the precious quality of yiras shamayim then they would merit being His treasure. Why specifically yiras shamayim and not any other

quality? - "...for Mine is the entire world." Every other quality is easily attainable for Hashem, for they stem from Him, as the Torah reiterates in *parshas* Eikev (*Devarim 10:12*), "What does Hashem, your G-d ask of you? Only to fear Hashem, your G-d." It is only through achieving proper *yiras shamayim* that we have the ability to be to Hashem "the most beloved treasure of all people."

Inequality For All

"These are the words that you shall speak to the Children of Israel." (Shemos 19:6)

Rashi, citing a *medrash*, deduces from this *pasuk* that Moshe was commanded by Hashem to tell *Klal Yisroel* precisely that which he was taught; no more and no less. This is somewhat difficult to comprehend. Could it be that Hashem was concerned that Moshe would purposely alter some of His words? Also, at the beginning of His conversation with Moshe, Hashem commands, "So shall you say to the House of Yaakov and tell to the Sons of Yisroel." Why then, does Hashem reiterate, "These are the words that you shall speak to the Children of Israel?" (*Shemos 19:6*)

Rav Matis Blum, *shlita*, in his *sefer* Torah L'daas explains that Rashi's commentary is actually in reference to a totally different idea altogether. Hashem was informing Moshe that his duty, as leader of *Klal Yisroel*, was not limited to teaching Torah to *Klal Yisroel* as a whole, but also to teach each and every Jew on an individual level as well. Each person according to their G-d given ability, no more and no less. For Hashem only expects us to work within the capabilities that He bestowed upon every one of us, with the ultimate goal being to work and strive to fulfill our own individualized potential.

The *mussar seforim* learn from the *gemarah* in Chullin (95a) a tremendous lesson about fulfilling one's own potential, and not someone else's. Mar Ukva said, "In regards to the following matter, compared to my father, I am like vinegar the son of wine: My father would wait

twenty four hours after he ate meat until he would eat dairy, whereas I only wait until the next meal (to eat dairy)." Instead of calling himself vinegar, why didn't Mar Ukva simply wait the twenty four hours, thus enabling himself to match the saintliness of his father? The answer is simple. Mar Ukva understood that at that point in time, in regards to waiting between meat and dairy, he was not yet at the level of his illustrious father. His goal was to reach his own saintliness, not his father's.

This concept is critical for those who are constantly striving to grow in avodas Hashem. We must recognize exactly who we are and what we must achieve, as Rashi tells us, "No more and no less."
